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1. INTRODUCTION

At East Point College of Pharmacy, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was established during the year 2017 with the following objectives

- c) **Responsibilities:** IQAC members should actively promote awareness within the institution and dedicate time to address procedural details.

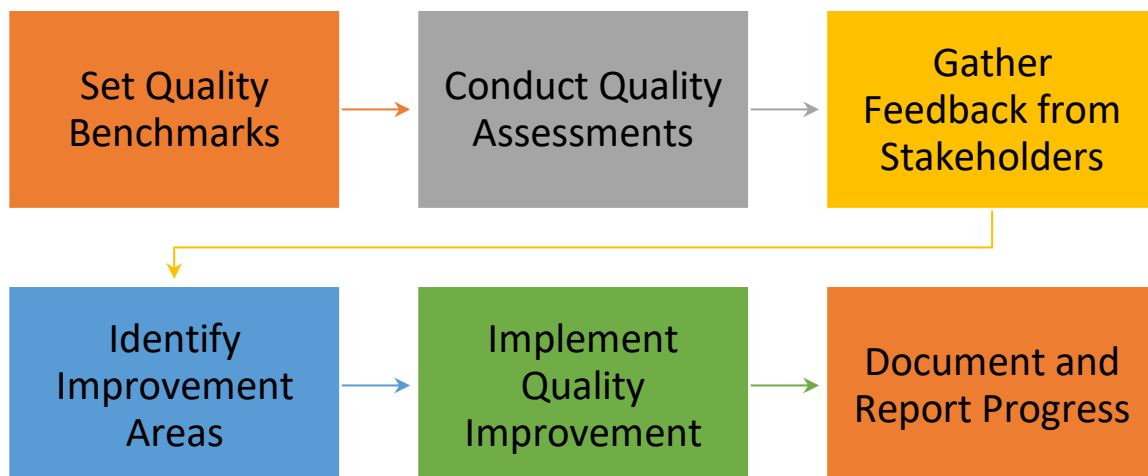
d) Member Selection Precautions:
